

MENDON TOWN HALL RENOVATIONS

Mendon, New York

Mendon Town Hall, adjacent to Honeoye Falls, was built c.1820 as a Gist Flower Mill. Water infiltration into this historic structure was taking a toll on the structure.

Site improvements include: a pocket park overlooking Honeoye Falls; parking lot reconstruction; renovation of the flood protection wall paralleling Honeoye Creek; implementation of handicapped accessibility improvements; and new signage interpreting the historic character of the site.

A collaborative effort between the Town of Mendon and Village of Honeoye Falls anticipates constructing a pedestrian link to an historic site adjacent to the Town Hall property.

The site improvements are funded by the Community Development Block Grant, NYS Bond Act, and the NYS Emergency Flood Control. These grants corner 80% of the project.
